- Appointing Power: Governor – 2
Speaker of the Assembly – 1
Senate Committee on Rules – 1

City Council of South Lake Tahoe – 1
- Number: Fifteen (15); California and Nevada each appoint (7) and one (1) non-voting President Appointee
- Special Considerations: Each member and employee shall disclose his economic interests in the region within ten (10) days after taking his seat on the governing board or being employed by the agency and shall thereafter disclose any further economic interest which he acquires, as soon as feasible after he acquires it.
(Gov. Code § 66801, Art. 3(a)(5).)
- Members appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly or the Senate Rules Committee may, subject to confirmation by the appointing power, designate an alternate to attend meetings and vote in the absence of the appointed member. An alternate shall be subject to those qualifications and requirements prescribed by this compact that are applicable to the appointed member.
(Gov. Code § 66801, Art. 3(a)(1)(B).)
- Qualifications: Governing body of the agency shall be constituted by the California delegation and the Nevada delegation.
(Gov. Code § 66801, Art. 3(a)(1-2).)
- Presidential appointment: 1 non-voting member
- California Delegation: 7 members (Gov. Code § 66801, Art. 3(a)(1)(A-B).)
- Governor appoints two (2)
 - Senate Committee on Rules appoints one (1)
 - Speaker of the Assembly appoints one (1)
- Members appointed by the Governor, the Senate Committee on Rules, or the Speaker of the Assembly shall not be

- County Board of Supervisor of El Dorado County appoints one (1)

Members may be a member of the county board of supervisors or city council, respectively, and shall reside in the territorial jurisdiction of the governmental body making the appointment.

Members appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly or the Senate Rules Committee may, subject to confirmation by the appointing power, designate an alternate to attend meetings and vote in the absence of the appointed member. An alternate shall be subject to those qualifications and requirements prescribed by this compact that are applicable to the appointed member.

Terms:

Pleasure of the appointing authority in each case, but each appointment shall be reviewed no less often than every four (4) years. (Gov. Code § 66801, Art. 3(c).)

Term Limits:

Members may be reappointed. (Gov. Code § 66801, Art. 3(c).)

Grace Period:

Shall continue to serve until a successor has been qualified. (Gov. Code § 1302.)

Compensation:

None, but the expenses of each member shall be met by the body which he represents in accordance with the law of that body. All other expenses incurred by the governing body in the course of

- Compensation (continued): exercising the powers conferred upon it by this compact unless met in some other manner specifically provided, shall be paid by the agency out of its own funds. (Gov. Code § 66801, Art. 3(b).)
- Meeting Frequency: Shall meet at least monthly. (Gov. Code § 66801, Art. 3(d).)
- Bond: Not stated in statute.
- Oath: Government Code §§ 1360 – 1363.
- Duties: Agency when acting upon matters that have a significant effect on the environment shall: (Gov. Code § 66801, Art. 7(a)(1-5).)
- Utilize a systematic, interdisciplinary approach which will insure the integrated use of the natural and social sciences and the environment design arts in planning and in decision making which may have an impact on man's environment.
 - Prepare and consider a detailed environmental impact statement before deciding to approve or carry out any project.
 - Study, develop and describe appropriate alternatives to recommended courses of action for any project which involves unresolved conflicts concerning alternatives uses of available resources.
 - Make available to states, counties, municipalities, institutions and individuals, advice and information useful in restoring, maintaining and enhancing the quality of the region's environment.
 - Initiate and utilize ecological information in the planning and development of resource-oriented projects.

COMMISSION ON TEACHER CREDENTIALING

Purpose: To inspire, educate and protect the students of California.

Authority: Education Code §§ 44210 et seq.

Appointing Power: Governor – 14 (requires Senate confirmation)

Number: Fifteen (15)

Special Considerations: Not more than one (1) member of the commission is to be appointed from the same school district or college or university campus. (Ed. Code § 44210(c).)

It is the intent of the Legislature that appointees to the commission reflect the ethnic and cultural diversity of the California public schools. (Ed. Code § 44210.5.)

Qualifications: Governor appoints fourteen (14): (Ed. Code § 44210(a)(2-7).)

- Six (6) practicing teachers from public elementary and secondary schools in California
- One (1) person who is employed on the basis of a services credential other than an administrative services credential
- One (1) member of a school district governing board
- Four (4) representatives of the public. None of these persons shall have been employed by an elementary or secondary school district in a position requiring certification, or shall have served as a school district governing board member in the five-year period immediately prior to his or her appointment to the commission
- One (1) school administrator in a public elementary or secondary school in California
- One (1) faculty member from a college or university that grants baccalaureate degrees

The Superintendent of Public Instruction or his or her designee. (Ed. Code § 44210(a).)

Representatives of statewide organizations may submit for the Governor's consideration the names of distinguished individuals to serve on the commission. (Ed. Code § 44211.)

Ex Officio Members:

- The Regents of the University of California, the Trustees of the California State University, the California Postsecondary Education Commission, and the Association of Independent California Colleges and Universities shall each appoint a

- Qualifications: representative to serve as member ex officio without vote in
(continued) proceedings of the commission. (Ed. Code § 44212(a)(1).)
- The Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges may appoint an alternate representative to serve as an ex officio member in the absence of the California Postsecondary Education Commission's representative. (Ed. Code § 44212(a)(2).)
- Term: Four (4) years.
- Each appointment shall expire on November 20 of the year of expiration of the applicable term. All appointments made pursuant to this section shall be subject to Education Code section 44213. (Ed. Code § 44210(e).)
- Term Limits: No person shall be appointed by the Governor to serve more than two (2) consecutive full terms. (Ed. Code § 44213.)
- Prior service on the commission for a term of less than three (3) years resulting from an initial appointment or an appointment for the remainder of an unexpired term shall not be counted as a full term. (Ed. Code § 44213.)
- Grace Period: Sixty (60) days. (Gov. Code § 1774.)
- Compensation: None, except as provided pursuant to Education Code section 44217 with respect to private citizens, members shall be reimbursed for their actual and necessary travel expenses. (Ed. Code § 44215.)
- The compensation of the members of the commission who are public employees shall not be reduced by the agency or body by which they are regularly employed for any absence from service occasioned by attendance upon the business of the commission, its committees or subcommittees. (Ed. Code § 44217.)
- Each school district which employs a member of the commission and which is required to employ a person to replace such member during his attendance at meetings of the commission or any committee or subcommittee thereof, shall be reimbursed from the Teacher Credentials Fund for the cost incurred by employing a replacement. (Ed. Code § 44217.)
- A private citizen member may be provided from the Teacher Credentials Fund a stipend of up to fifty dollars (\$50) per day, exclusive of per diem, for attendance at a meeting of the

Compensation: commission or any committee or subcommittee thereof, if such
(continued) attendance results in loss of income. (Ed. Code § 44217.)

Meeting

Frequency: Shall meet as deemed appropriate and necessary by the chair and the executive committee to accomplish its duties, but shall meet no fewer than once (1) each quarter of the year. (Ed. Code § 44219.)

In order than any allegation of misconduct and the effect thereof, if any, upon the application or credential of a certified employee are determined, no later than six (6) months after an investigation is commenced, the commission or the Committee of Credentials shall meet more frequently than once (1) each quarter, if possible. (Ed. Code § 44220.)

Bond: Not stated in statute.

Oath: Government Code §§ 1360 – 1363.

Duties: Establish professional standards, assessments, and examinations for entry and advancement in the education profession. While the Legislature recognizes that the commission will exercise its prerogative to determine those requirements, it is the intent of the Legislature that standards, assessments, and examinations be developed and implemented for the following:
(Ed. Code § 44225(a).)

- Reduce and streamline the credential system to ensure teacher competence in the subject fields or fields, while allowing greater flexibility in staffing local schools. (Ed. Code § 44225(b).)
- Review and, if necessary, revise the code of ethics for the teaching profession. (Ed. Code § 44225(c).)
- Determine the scope and authorization of credentials, to ensure competence in teaching and other educational services, and establish sanctions for the misuse of credentials and the misassignment of credential holders. The commission may grant and added or supplementary authorization to a credential holder who has met the requirements and standards of the commission for the added or supplementary authorization. (Ed. Code § 44225(e).)
- Collect, compile, and disseminate information regarding exemplary practices in supporting and assessing beginning teachers. (Ed. Code § 44225(f).)
- It is the intent of the Legislature that the commission develop models for voluntary use by California colleges and universities which do not have these models in place, to

assist in the screening of applications for admission to teacher education programs. (Ed. Code § 44225(n).)

- Grant a field placement certificate to any candidate who has been admitted to an accredited program of professional preparation, and who must complete a supervised practicum in public elementary or secondary schools as a condition for completion of the program. The commission shall establish standards for the issuance of field placement certificates. (Ed. Code § 44225(p).)

The Commission on Teacher Credentialing, in cooperation with public and private postsecondary institutions operating teacher education programs, shall develop standards and procedures which ensure that each faculty member who teaches a course relating to teaching methods in an approved program of professional preparation actively participates in public elementary or secondary schools and classrooms at least once every three academic years. (Ed. Code § 44227.5(b).)

The commission, in cooperation with public and private postsecondary institutions operating administrative services credential programs, shall develop standards and procedures which ensure that each faculty member who teaches a course relating to administrative methods as defined by the commission in an approved program of professional preparation actively participates in public elementary or secondary schools or classrooms at least once every three academic years. (Ed. Code § 44227.5(c).)

TEACHERS' RETIREMENT BOARD

Purpose: To set policies and make rules for the California Teachers' Retirement System and is responsible for ensuring benefits are paid by the system in accordance with law.

Authority: Education Code §§ 22200 et seq.

Appointing Power: Governor – 5 (requires Senate confirmation)

Number: Twelve (12)

Special Considerations:

Qualifications: Governor appoints five (5) members:
(Ed. Code § 22200(a)(6)(A-C).)

- One (1) who, at the time of appointment, is a member of the governing board of a school district or a community college district
- One (1) who is either a retired member under this part or a retired participant under Part 14 (commencing with Section 26000)
- Three (3) persons representing the public.

Superintendent of Public Instruction; (Ed. Code § 22200(a)(1).)

Controller. (Ed. Code § 22200(a)(2).)

Treasurer. (Ed. Code § 22200(a)(3).)

Director of Finance. (Ed. Code § 22200(a)(4).)

Three (3) elected members who are either members of the Defined Benefit program or participants in the Cash Balance Benefit Program, as follows: (Ed. Code § 22200(a)(5)(A-C).)

- One (1) person who, at the time of election, is an active member of the Defined Benefit Program or an active participant of the Cash Balance Benefit Program employed by a school district that provides instruction for Pre-K and grades K to 12, inclusive, or a county office of education, in a position other than a school administrator that requires a services credential with a specialization in administrative services. This member shall be elected by the active members of the Defined Benefit Program and active participants of the Cash Balance Benefit Program who are employed by a school district that provides instruction for Pre-K and grades K to 12, inclusive,

or county office of education, pursuant to regulations adopted by the board.

- One (1) person who, at the time of election, is an active member of the Defined Benefit Program or an active participant of the Cash Balance Benefit Program employed by a school district that provides instruction for Pre-K and grades K to 12, inclusive, or a county office of education. This member shall be elected by the active members of the Defined Benefit Program and active participants of the Cash Balance Benefit Program who are employed by a school district that provides instruction for Pre-K and grades K to 12, inclusive, or a county office of education, pursuant to regulations adopted by the board.
- One (1) person who, at the time of election, is a community college instructor and an active member of the Defined Benefit Program or an active participant of the Cash Balance Benefit Program employed by a community college district, who shall be elected by the active community college members of the Defined Benefit Program and the active community college participants of the Cash Balance Benefit Program, pursuant to regulations adopted by the board.

The board shall conduct the elections of members described in Education Code section 22200 pursuant to regulations adopted by the board. (Ed. Code § 22200.5(a).)

Term:

Four (4) years. (Ed. Code § 22200(a).)

The board shall hold special elections to fill vacancies that occur during the term of the elected members of the board. If, at the time a vacancy occurs, the unexpired term is less than two (2) years, the new member elected to fill the vacancy shall hold office for a period equal to the remainder of the term of the vacated office plus four (4) years. (Ed. Code § 22200.5(b).)

Term Limits:

Not stated in statute.

Grace Period:

Sixty (60) days. (Gov. Code § 1774.)

Compensation:

Public members appointed by the Governor, who are not members of the Defined Benefit Program or participants of the Cash Balance Benefit Program shall receive one hundred dollars (\$100) for every day of actual attendance at meetings conducted for the purpose of carrying out the powers and duties of the board, together with necessary traveling expenses. (Ed. Code § 22223.)

The compensation of the members of the Defined Benefit Program and participants of the Cash Balance Benefit Program who are either elected to the board or appointed to the board, or who are appointed by the board to a committee or subcommittee, or to a panel of the system, may not be reduced by his or her employer for any absence from service occasioned by attendance upon the business of the board, pursuant to Education Code § 22224. (Ed. Code § 22225(a).)

Each employer that employs either a member of the Defined Benefit Program or a participant of the Cash Balance Benefit Program appointed pursuant to Education Code § 22224 and that employs a person to replace the member or participant during attendance at meetings of the board, its committees or subcommittees, or when serving as a member of a panel of the system, or when carrying out other duties approved by the board, shall be reimbursed from the retirement fund for the cost incurred by employing a replacement. (Ed. Code § 22225(b).)

Meeting
Frequency:

Shall meet at least once (1) every calendar quarter at such times as it may determine. (Ed. Code § 22201(b).)

Bond:

Not stated in statute.

Oath:

Government Code §§ 1360 – 1363.

Duties:

Shall set policy and shall have the sole power and authority to hear and determine all facts pertaining to application for benefits under the plan or any matters pertaining to administration of the plan and the system. (Ed. Code § 22201(a).)

Has exclusive control of the administration of the funds. No transfers or disbursements of any amount from the funds shall be made except upon the authorization of the board for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this part and Part 14 (commencing with Section 26000). (Ed. Code § 22202.)

Has exclusive control of the investment of the Teachers' Retirement Fund. Except as otherwise restricted by the California Constitution and by law, the board may in its discretion invest the assets of the fund through the purchase, holding, or sale thereof of any investment, financial instrument, or financial transaction when the investment, financial instrument, or financial transaction is prudent in the informed opinion of the board. (Ed. Code § 22203.)

Shall conduct a study on providing health insurance benefits, including vision and dental care benefits, for active, disabled, and retired members, beneficiaries, children, and dependent parents. The health insurance may include vision and dental care. (Ed. Code § 22226(a).)

Purpose: Advise the Department of Health Services and the Department of Education with respect to policy development, integration, and evaluation of tobacco education programs funded under this article, and for development of a master plan for the future implementation of tobacco education programs.

Authority: Health and Safety Code §§ 104365 et seq.

Appointing Power: Governor – 8
Senate Committee on Rules – 2
Speaker of the Assembly – 2
Superintendent of Public Instruction – 1

Number: Thirteen (13)

Special Considerations:

Qualifications: Governor appoints eight (8):
(Health & Saf. Code § 104365(b)(4-6,8-11).)

- One (1) member of a university facility with expertise in programs intended to reduce tobacco use
- Two (2) representatives of a target population group
- One (1) representative of the State Department of Health Services
- One (1) member representing the interests of the general public
- One (1) representative of local health departments
- One (1) member representing a volunteer health organization dedicated to the reduction of tobacco associated injury
- One (1) member from the Tobacco Related Disease Research Program

Senate Committee on Rules appoints two (2):
(Health & Saf. Code § 104365(b)(2-3).)

- One (1) member representing an organization that represents health care employees
- One (1) member of a professional education association, such as an association of teachers

Speaker of the Assembly appoints two (2) members representing volunteer health organizations dedicated to the reduction of tobacco use. (Health & Saf. Code § 104365(b)(1).)

- Term Limits: None. (Health & Saf. Code § 104365(c).)
- Grace Period: Shall continue to serve until a successor has been qualified. (Gov. Code. § 1302.)
- Compensation: None, except for necessary travel expenses. (Health & Saf. Code § 104365(e).)
- Meeting Frequency: Shall meet as often as it deems necessary, but shall not meet less than four (4) times per year. (Health & Saf. Code § 104365(d).)
- Bond: Not stated in statute.
- Oath: Government Code §§ 1360 – 1363.
- Duties: The committee shall be advisory to the Department of Health Services, the University of California, the State Department of Education for the following purposes:
(Health & Saf. Code § 104370(a-c,e-f).)
- Evaluation of research, school- and community-based programs funded under this article as necessary in order to assess the overall effectiveness of efforts made by the programs to reduce the use of tobacco products. In order to evaluate tobacco education, research, and cessation programs, the committee shall seek the cooperation and assistance of the department, the State Department of Education, county offices of education, local lead agencies, administrative representatives, target populations, school officials, and researchers. A principal measurement of effectiveness shall be reduction of smoking rates among a given target population;
 - Facilitation of programs directed at reducing and eliminating tobacco use that are operated jointly by more than one agency or entity. The committee shall propose strategies for the coordination of proposed programs administered by the department, the University of California, and the State Department of Education in order to avoid the duplication of services and to maximize the public benefit of the programs;
 - Make recommendations to the department, the University of California, and the State Department of Education regarding

- the most appropriate criteria for the selection of, standards of the operation of, and the types of programs to be funded under this article;
- Ensuring that the most current research findings regarding tobacco use prevention are applied in designing the tobacco education programs administered by the department and the State Department of Education. The department and the State Department of Education shall apply the most current findings and recommendations of research including research funded by the Research Account of the Cigarette and Tobacco Products Surtax Fund created by Section 30122 of the Revenue and Taxation Code;
- Based on the results of programs supported by this article and any other proven methodologies available to the committee, produce a comprehensive master plan for implementing tobacco education programs throughout this state for the preventing and cessation of tobacco use. The master plan and its revisions shall include recommendations on administrative arrangements, funding priorities, integration and coordination of approaches by the department, the University of California, and the State Department of Education and their support systems, as well as progress reports relating to each target population.

To prevent tobacco-related diseases and diminish tobacco use, the Department on State Health Services shall establish within the department a program on tobacco use and health to reduce tobacco use in California by conducting health education interventions and behavior change programs at the state level, in the community, and other non-school settings.

Number: Three (3)

Special Considerations:

Regardless of the number of ballots received for a referendum, the nominee for each commissioner slot with the most weighted votes from assessed businesses within that industry category shall be elected commissioner. The number of commissioners elected from each industry category shall be determined by the weighted percentage of assessments from that category. (Gov. Code § 13995.40(d).)

The Director of the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (GO-Biz). (Gov. Code § 13995.40(b)(1).)

Term: Four (4) years. (Gov. Code § 13995.40(h).)

The terms of each elected commissioner shall commence July 1 of the next year following his or her election, and shall expire on June 30 of the fourth year following his or her election. (Gov. Code § 13995.40(f)(1).)

CALIFORNIA WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD

Purpose: Responsible for assisting the Governor in the development, oversight, and continuous improvement of California's workforce investment system. The board encourages collaboration among other State and local public and private entities.

Authority: Unemployment Insurance Code §§ 14010 et seq.

Appointing Power: Governor

Special Considerations: The members of the board shall represent diverse geographic areas of the state, including urban, rural, and suburban areas. (Unemp. Ins. Code § 14012(e)(2).)

Qualifications: The board shall be comprised of the Governor and representatives from the following categories:

Two (2) members of each house of the Legislature, appointed by the appropriate presiding officer of each house. (Unemp. Ins. Code, § 14012(a).)

A majority of the board members, appointed by the Governor, shall be representative of business who: (Unemp. Ins. Code, § 14012(b)(1-3).)

- Are owners of businesses, chief executives or operating officers of businesses, and other business executives or employers with optimum policymaking or hiring authority, including members of local boards described in Section 3122(b)(2)(A)(i) of Title 29 of the United States Code.
- Represent businesses, including small businesses, or organizations representing business that include high-quality, work-relevant training and development in in-demand industry sectors or occupations in the state.
- Are appointed from a group of individuals nominated by state business organizations and business trade associations.

Not less than 20 percent of board members shall be representatives of the workforce within the state, including representatives of labor organizations nominated by state labor federations, who shall not be less than 15 percent of the board membership and who shall include at least one (1) representative that is a member of a labor organization or a training director, from a joint labor-management apprenticeship program, or if no such joint program exists in the state, such a representative of an apprenticeship program in the state. (Unemp. Ins. Code, § 14012(c)(1).)

Qualifications
continued:

Representatives of community-based organizations that have demonstrated experience and expertise in addressing the employment, training, or education needs of individuals with barriers to employment, including organizations that serve veterans or that provide or support competitive, integrated employment for individuals with disabilities.

(Unemp. Ins. Code, § 14012(c)(2)(A).)

Representatives of organizations that have demonstrated experience and expertise in addressing the employment, training, or education needs of eligible youth, including representatives of organizations that serve out-of-school youth.

(Unemp. Ins. Code, § 14012(c)(2)(B).)

The balance of board members:

(Unemp. Ins. Code, § 14012(d)(1-2).

- Shall include representatives of government that are lead state officials with primary responsibility for the core programs and shall include chief elected officials, collectively representing cities, counties, and cities and counties where appropriate.
- May include other representatives and officials as the Governor may designate, like any of the following:
 - State agency officials from agencies that are one-stop partners, not specified in paragraph (1), including additional one-stop partners whose programs are covered by the State Plan, if any.
 - State agency officials responsible for economic development or juvenile justice programs in the state.
 - Individuals who represent an Indian tribe or tribal organization, as those terms are defined in Section 3221(b) of Title 29 of the United States Code.
 - State agency officials responsible for education programs in the state, including chief executive officers, or their designees, of institutions of higher education, including, but not limited to, the California Community College system, the California State University system, the University of California system, and their respective individual campuses.

Term:

Pleasure of the appointing authority.

Term Limits:

Not stated in statute.

Grace Period:

Shall continue to serve until a successor has been qualified.
(Gov. Code § 1302.)

Coordinating the development and continuous improvement of comprehensive state performance measures, including state adjusted levels of performance, to assess the effectiveness of the workforce investment activities in the state.
