REQUEST FOR PRESIDENTIAL EMERGENCY DECLARATION COVER LETTER

Dear Mr. President:

Under the provisions of Section 401 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. sections 5121-5207 (Stafford Act), and implemented by Title 44 of the Code of Federal Regulations section 206.35, I request you issue an Emergency Declaration for Direct Federal Assistance for Shasta County, as a result of the Carr Fire, which is still burning.

Beginning on July 23, 2018, the Carr Fire broke out in Shasta County during exceptionally dangerous fire weather conditions, including extremely hot temperatures, low humidity, and erratic winds. These conditions have caused the Carr Fire to grow uncontrollably, causing widespread destruction and at least two fatalities. To date, the Carr Fire has currently burned over 44,450 acres and is merely 3 percent contained.

The Carr Fire has already forced approximately 30,000 residents from more than 11,000 households to evacuate their homes and seek temporary shelter. Many residents had little time to flee due to the fire's rapid and erratic rate of spread through the rural terrain. Thus far, evacuations have impacted communities that include, but are not limited to, French Gulch, Keswick, Old Shasta, Victoria Highlands, Whiskeytown, and Whiskey Creek. Officials anticipate more evacuation orders will be issued as the fires spread continues towards even more heavily populated areas within the city of Redding.

On July 26, 2018, I declared, under the California Emergency Services Act, a State of Emergency in Shasta County. The Office of Emergency Services activated the State Operations Center, as well as the Inland Regional Emergency Operations Center. The State activated its Emergency Plan and deployed all available assets, including the local and state mutual aid, the California National Guard and out-of-state assistance. Additionally, the Federal Emergency Management Agency approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant for the fire.

California has suffered many devastating disasters within the last year, including the deadliest wildfires in the state's history. Last October, you issued a Major Disaster Declaration (FEMA-4344-DR-CA) for wildfires in Northern California that destroyed thousands of structures and claimed 43 lives. Further, beginning in December 2017, the largest wildfire in California history, the Thomas Fire, erupted in Southern California which burned hundreds of thousands of acres. Following that fire, a deadly mudslide took more than 20 lives. The fires and mudslides caused unprecedented damage and destruction and resulted in another Major Disaster Declaration (FEMA-4353-DR-CA). These disasters have severely impacted California's resources.

I have determined this incident is of such severity and magnitude that continued effective response is beyond the capabilities of the State and affected local governments and supplemental federal assistance is necessary to save lives and to protect property, public health and safety, and to lessen the effects of this imminent catastrophe. I am requesting Direct Federal Assistance, including Department of Defense air assets to immediately mitigate the impacts of this fire;

shelter supplies and water for 30,000 evacuated residents in Shasta County; U.S. Department of Agriculture's assistance in evacuating large animals; mass care; evacuation assistance for individuals with access and functional needs; and ambulatory transport.

I certify for this emergency, the State and local governments will assume all applicable non-federal share costs as required by the Stafford Act. I have designated the Director of the Office of Emergency Services, Mark Ghilarducci, as the State Coordinating Officer for this request. Mr. Ghilarducci will work with FEMA on my behalf.
